APS SPORT CRITERIA FOR 'CORE SPORT' STATUS - FINAL

The following recommendations have been established for a Sport to be considered for 'Core sport' status in APS Sport competition:

- 1. The sport has a governing body, which has set rules and regulations in place that can be used to conduct competition.
- 2. Interested schools need to have participated in competition run by a governing body or Schools at First level, for a period of two or more consecutive seasons.
- 3. During this period, the sport needs to have demonstrated growth or maintained sustainability, with competition having six or more schools at First level for Boys and 3 or more schools at Firsts level for Girls participating.
- **4.** At this point, participating schools would assess the sustainability of the sport and see if it can be administered by the APS Sport office. A logistical study (refer requirements, below) would be completed. If deemed viable (ongoing), a proposal would be prepared and submitted to the Delegates Committee. This proposal would recommend the sport be introduced as an APS 'Core Sport' on a two year trial basis (with the APS Sport office to administer the sport).
- 5. If endorsed by a majority vote at Delegates Committee level, a Motion would be established for the APS Heads to consider.
- 6. If approved by the APS Heads, competition for this sport would be offered and run on a trial basis. Rules and regulations from the governing body would be used as a basis for setting up the APS Sport Regulations.
- 7. A review would be completed at the end of each season to assess the success of the new sport. Providing the competition remained sustainable during the two year trial period, a further recommendation could be made for the sport to become a permanent offering and hold premiership status (as per General Regulations, eight Boys/four Girls or more Firsts teams would have to be participating).
- **8.** If the number of competing schools drops to five Boys/two Girls or less in Firsts the sport may lose its core sport status.

Prior to recommending a sport for core sport status:

A Working Party of Delegates would be nominated to complete a **logistical study** prior to introduction, looking at:

- Availability of resources, venues/ facilities and referees
- The feasibility of the Sport remaining popular and viable over time (growth)
- How the introduction of a new sport will impact other long standing sports
- The cost of the sport to schools involved (ie. uniforms, equipment, coaches)
- · Inherent risk assessment
- Additional cost to the APS Sport office
- Support of the sport's governing body to run a stand-alone competition.

Administration of a new sport requires:

- APS Sport to produce Fixtures (Home & Away or Central venue/s)
- APS Sport develop and maintain Regulations
- APS Sport manage Weekly Results and Ladders
- If played at school venues, coordination of Umpires/Referees to be arranged by home school
- If played at a central venue:
 - APS Sport request Bookings/Hire
 - APS Sport arrange provision of First Aid
 - APS Sport to access and arrange Umpires/Referees
- APS Sport to conduct an annual Review

The APS Heads can consider having APS Sport add and provide the administration for a new sport into their 'Core Sport' program once the abovementioned criteria have been achieved.
