- 1. See General Regulations Governing Sporting Competitions.
- 2. Badminton is conducted under the rules of the Badminton Victoria unless otherwise stated.
- 3. Teams consist of a maximum 20 players.

 Schools should rank their players 1-20 (1 being the strongest) to a maximum of 10 pairs. Players pair up to play in rank order, 1 & 2, 3 & 4, etc.
- 4. All matches shall be played as doubles (one set only) as first to 11 points or 21 points, with a lead of 2 points. If the scores are tied at the agreed upon number then the pair winning the next point will win the match.
- 5. Coaches should negotiate upon arrival at the venue whether they are playing matches to 21 or 11, this will usually be dictated by number of students or length of time for play.
- 6. Order of Play:

- 7. If a team is short, arrangements shall be made between coaches as to how the match should proceed.
- 8. Shuttles for all teams will use plastic shuttles (Carlton Blue or Epsilon Blue). Home teams as indicated in the fixture to supply shuttles.
- 9. All players should be suitably attired for racquet sports.
- Teams should aim to arrive 5 minutes before scheduled starting time of their match.
 Hit-ups on court should be kept to a minimum out of consideration of time constraints.
- 11. Please utilise score sheets for consistency across each team.
