- 1. See General Regulations Governing Sporting Competition.
- 2. Rowing is conducted under the rules of Rowing Victoria (RV) unless otherwise stated and according to the APS Racing Code. **Zonal Umpiring will be implemented from 2024 onwards.**

3. **REGATTAS**

3.1 Coaching during the race.

All coaches should note that that the APS forbids any coaching from the bank whether by voice, using amplification, by radio or any other means. Offenders risk disqualification of their crew or removal of that crew from the race. It should be understood that the ethics of racing are that it is a race between the crews concerned and that coaches should leave it to the participants.

- 3.2 Order of Entry: Schools should enter all crews from the top down. The top down entry for all crews occur according to the following existing divisions: Girls Open First VIII, Open Second VIII, Open Third VIII, Open IV.
- 3.3 In the lowest division if two schools are entered in any Senior (Open) event, this event must be included in the Head of the River program.
- 3.4 Should First VIII Crews not be able to be separated on ranking at the Head of the Schoolgirls, then the results of the Victorian State Championships will be taken into consideration for seeding for The APS Regatta (Heads of the River).
- 3.5 From 2023 onwards, all Open 2000m events at the APS Regatta (Heads of the River) with between 4 and 6 entries race a Preliminary Event.
- 3.6 From 2023 the APS Girls and Boys Regatta (Heads of the River) race will alternate and the entire program schedule including the Presentations should reflect the change annually.
- 4. At The APS Regatta no crew may row before the proclaimed sunrise time. (2026: 7:22am)
- 5. **Safety Officer:** At The APS Regatta (Heads of the River) Regatta, a Safety Officer be on the Course from 12.00 pm Friday, and from sunrise until 15 minutes before the first race on Saturday, with associated traffic management plans as part of the overall safety management plan.
- 6. **Presentation:** At the conclusion of The APS Regatta (Heads of the River) both winning crews will row to the landing for the Trophy Presentations.
- 7. **Invited Crews:** The APS Heads will determine the invitation of Girls' schools to participate.

In 2023 Division 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be unrestricted, in 2025 Year 10 Division 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be unrestricted etc. **Year 9:** For 2022 there will be 6 Quad Divisions (1 to 6), and this will increase at a rate of 2 per year. Eg. In 2022 there will be Divisions (1 to 8), in 2023, there will be 10 Divisions (1 to 10). The

number of divisions for Fours will reduce over time.
